SUBJECT: 2055 MTP – Draft Projects & Programs Public Engagement Update  
DATE: November 19, 2025

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CAMPO staff began conducting public outreach for the Destination 2055 (MTP) draft set of projects and programs in October of 2025. The goal of the engagement effort was to:

- Increase public awareness of CAMPO and the MTP (or that an official regional transportation planning process exists) in general,
- Share information and solicit feedback regarding the draft project lists and programs that would make up Destination 2055.
- Inform members of the community about the November 19th public hearing and opportunity to comment through an online survey, email, etc.

To inform participants of the Executive Board’s final decisions, and how their input influenced those outcomes, upon adoption of the Draft Projects and Programs, CAMPO staff will send an email update and post comments received on the website, including a response regarding disposition. The website will also be updated with an interactive map of all projects and other relevant adoption materials.

**Engagement & Outreach Mechanics:**

During Fall of 2025, community engagement efforts occurred using three primary tactics:

- 1) **Online survey** with educational info about the MTP and draft project lists. Respondents could submit comments through interactive maps for Roadways and Transit, or through open comment boxes for any mode, including bike/ped.
  - a. A spreadsheet of comments received is attached.
  - b. Outreach for the survey occurred through word of mouth, social media and email blasts, paid social media advertising, and in-person events.
    - i. Social media was most successful according to respondents
- 2) **In-person tabling events** – CAMPO staff hosted seven (7) tables/popups at community events and gathering places to increase awareness about the online survey. Posters with maps for Bike/Ped improvements, Transit, and Roadways were taken to all events to aid in collecting feedback, as well. A summary of the popup events is included as an attachment below.
- 3) **Comments** were also received via email. No paper/mail or voicemail comments were received.

For the survey and email, over 120 comments were received from an estimated 60-70 participants.

### Overall Theme/s of Comment/s:

- **Over half of survey and email comments were related to specific projects** ranging from requests to remove projects, increase a project's priority, or adjust project scope. CAMPO staff reviewed each one and have provided a staff response to each in the attached spreadsheet.
- **Land-use:** While opposition to increased growth was in several written comments, it was the most prevalent theme at popups. There was often a general weariness of new residential development based on the perception that it will increase roadway congestion and change the character of local communities. However, the longer the conversation, the more likely the commenter would be in strong support of increased density in concentrated areas if it could be paired with open space, agricultural, and historic land preservation.
- Several comments simply state that they are in **support of the overall plan and projects, the plan's increased focus on new revenues for additional bike/ped improvements; statements of willingness to pay more taxes for plan's implementation.**
- **Support for bicycle & pedestrian improvements** via greenways/trails as well as side paths in conjunction with roadway projects. Strong support for continued implementation of complete street elements in roadway projects.
- **Support for all types of transit** – regional rail, BRT, increased bus service across Wake County and to Clayton. Specific comments provided BRT and bus routing suggestions. At in-person events in more rural areas, curiosity and interest in providing transit options were prevalent (Granville, Harnett/Angier, and Clayton area, in particular).
- Desire for more **travel options** (bike/ped and transit) for persons who cannot drive whether due to **age (young and old), income, or disability.**
- **Safety** as a priority was not prevalent in written comments through the survey; but safety came up frequently during in-person (popup) discussions, especially related to **bicycle and pedestrian facilities** and perception that vehicles are generally driving above the **speed** limit on roads across the region.
- **Environment**, negative impact of gas operated vehicles and need to provide **other modes** of travel



## 2055 MTP Draft Projects & Programs (October-November 2025) In-Person Pop-Up/Tabling Event Summary

*CAMPO staff attended seven events/locations to share information with people across the region about the latest projects and programs that could be included in the 2055 update to the MTP. Most tabling events, or popups, occurred at large community events and festivals. A breakdown of discussions and themes of comments received at each event is outlined below.*

**Event:** White Cane Day

**Location:** ArtSpace, 201 E Davie St, Raleigh, NC

**Date:** 10/15/2025 from 11am-12:30pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Bonnie, Sarah, Caleb

### **Summary of Event:**

The White Cane event is an annual event hosted by Artspace that “celebrates the independence of people who are blind or visually impaired”. Our table was located in the Artspace lobby, which had probably about 20 patrons. Artspace is the location where attendees who attended the advocacy march ended their route, and also where ride pickups departed from. There were many more people who attended the overall event, outside, and the weather was nice so fewer people came inside to congregate. It may be worth setting up somewhere more populated in the future. Patrons to the event were visually impaired and racially diverse. Most interactions were limited to handing out materials, but Bonnie connected with a few gentlemen who are leaders in the visually impaired community.

### **Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- Attendees were generally interested in CAMPO and any transportation services provided by the MPO
- There was also interest in the long-range plan and ensuring consideration is being given to the diversity of needs among pedestrian infrastructure. Wanted to make sure staff and decision makers understand this type of infrastructure is not a luxury for their community but it’s often the only way they can travel independently.
- Three community connections were made with commitments of CAMPO staff attending future meetings or providing more info to each org about what CAMPO does and how we can improve access to our engagement efforts.
  - 1) Bill Smith of Raleigh Bike Ped Advisory Committee (Bonnie and Jacob met with him to make connection recently. Advocate for pedestrian infrastructure improvements
  - 2) Rev. Parrish, Wake Federation of the Blind, Raleigh Commission for Persons with Disabilities (<https://governormoreheadfoundation.org/bios/robert-parrish/>). He agreed to offer assistance with advising on future engagement materials and making them accessible for visually impaired populations
  - 3) Rob Marshall, Lions Club of North Carolina (think eyeglass donations). He said he would reach out to Bonnie to further connection with their Foundation.

**Event:** Harper Hour

**Location:** 207 Main St, Knightdale, NC

**Date:** 10/16/2025 from 4:30pm-7:30pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Gerald and Bonnie

**Summary of Event:**

The Town of Knightdale Dept. of Parks & Recreation hosted CAMPO at this event. Harper Hour is an event held at Harper Park, drawing local community members from the neighboring area, especially families with children due to the playground, as well as adults. On the 16<sup>th</sup>, there was a pickleball tournament occurring and a local brewery and food truck were also setup. The Parks Department also had info materials about their programs, and a lawn of yard games for attendees.

The weather was beautiful, and the event had approximately 30-40 attendees. While CAMPO was located in an excellent location near the food trucks and brew tent, few people were actually coming to the table. Bonnie and Gerald had in depth conversations with 5 or so individual people or groups/families. Materials were given to another 5-10.

**Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- Due to the low number of comments, only three really stand out
  - A long-time resident and developer was very interested in learning of the transportation maps available on CAMPO's website in order to better understand the type of growth and infrastructure to anticipate in the future. He expressed frustration that transportation improvements typically lag behind needs – congestion on the rise. He also expressed an interest in learning more about transit plans in the future, especially in Knightdale and Cary, and took the 2035 Wake Transit Plan investments brochure.
  - One recently transplanted family with elementary age children expressed a desire for safety improvements across the network, especially for bicycling.
  - One teenager expressed a desire for both bicycling and bus improvements across the region. Said he does not want a car.

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**Event:** Lillington Halloween Trunk-r-Treat

**Location:** Lillington Ball Park, 307 S. 1<sup>st</sup> St, Lillington, NC

**Date:** 10/24/2025 from 5pm-8pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Tim and Alex

**Summary of Event:**

Large family-oriented event for distributing candy to small children (trunk or treat) in a rural/small town. Estimated attendees were 1,000-1,500 and was hosted at local park/baseball facility. Pop up table was created using back of personal staff pickup truck and was located along the baseball field with other vehicles distributing candy. Location was excellent as it provided high degree of exposure to attendees as they passed along candy distribution corridor. Most adult participants did not comment on available materials but ~1:10 would look at the maps or request a swag item. ~1:25

would comment or otherwise have follow up conversations with staff about projects depicted in maps. Age/gender demographics were geared towards young families with small children although there were small clusters of older attendees. Racial demographics were mixed but likely representative of distribution of the local community. Overall response to staff and plans was positive and several attendees took offered bookmarks with QR code for further information. Local event organizer requested photo of the organization booth and staff for posting to social media (Facebook). – Tim S.

**Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- Primary discussions or comments centered on transit options, future bike/ped facilities, larger planned roadway projects in / near town and general weariness of influx of new residential development.

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**Event:** Clayton Harvest Festival

**Location:** Main Street, Clayton, NC

**Date:** 10/25/2025 from 9am-4pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Caleb, Kenneth, Mike, and Crystal

**Other Org or Consultant Attendees:** Corinne Miller, Robert Tate, Clayton Staff

**Summary of Event:**

Annual Clayton Harvest Festival – Expected attendance over 30k for 4-day event. CAMPO staff attended on Saturday. Attendance was heavy all day throughout the event, with a mix of age groups, ethnic/race backgrounds and visitors from a wide region from Garner east throughout Johnston County. During the afternoon, CAMPO staff interacted directly with 50+ attendees who showed an interest in bike and pedestrian facilities, transit and rail transportation options; with additional interest in current and future road projects. Most of these attendees also took a bookmark with the intention of exploring the plans further online and completing the survey. There were also some others who browsed the displays, took a bookmark, but did not have specific questions or input. CAMPO's tent was included with other Clayton Departments. Due to size of area, our maps were propped up against the front of the table making them hard to see. Better quality maps and additional space to place the maps on easels might have helped the engagement. This event was a true “gold mine” of pop-up events with interactions occurring before the 9:00 am start until the end. The scope of the visitors varied – from Wake Forest to Missouri to Denmark; with the Danish having an interest in more access to the area by bicycles.

**Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- Safer bike lanes
- More sidewalks and pedestrian facilities
- Interest in commuter rail and transit options especially for the elderly and disadvantaged populations
- Interest in BRT and perhaps earlier implementation, especially with options to Raleigh and Durham
- Desire for US 70 Business through the town to the US 70 freeway to be widened to six lanes

- Interest in regional rail, as well as Amtrak service through downtown Clayton

**Event:** HollyFest 2025

**Location:** 2401 Grigsby Ave., Holly Springs, NC

**Date:** 10/25/2025 from 9:30am-3pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Cara, Evan, Daniel, and Lisa

**Summary of Event:**

Holly Fest is an annual, free family-friendly event celebrates Holly Springs and all the people, places, and services offered in town. Featuring local artists, businesses, food vendors, children's activities, and local entertainment. It was a largely attended event for the town of Holly Springs and we did talk to families that attended that were from further south of the area (as far as Fayetteville). We were located next to a children's pumpkin painting activity in the nonprofit section and across the aisle was the debut of the Town's micro transit vehicle, the hopper grouped with development services/town department information. There were at least 50+ attendees that stopped by our table to talk.

**Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- How do we fix Highway 55
- What is going to happen with transit here (in the area of southern Wake/Holly Springs)? Why is there commuter rail on the map?
- We like greenways

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**Event:** Urban Planning Party

**Location:** 700 Brooks Avenue, Raleigh, NC 27607

**Date:** 10/26/2025

**Time:** 12:45pm-3pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Jacob and Bonnie

**Summary of Event:**

The Urban Planning Party was held at the Brooks Avenue Church of Christ. There were roughly 20 attendees at the event. There was a good mix of age groups, ethnic/racial groups present at the event. The pop-up table was in the back of the room near the entrance along with multiple tables with posterboards displaying urban planning facts. Staff engaged with roughly 8 people (roughly 5-10 minutes each); most of whom were Raleigh residents. One or two of the attendees that talked with staff were from Clayton. All of the attendees who engaged with staff were interested in the improvement/expansion of active transportation infrastructure (bike/ped and transit). Overall, most of the conversations were positive but one attendee was frustrated about the tolling of the southern portion of I-540.

**Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- One of the attendees mentioned that she would love for there to be a more direct bus route for her to use to get to work and the grocery store from her neighborhood. She mentioned that she used to ride the GoRaleigh bus while she was in college and missed having that as a travel option.
- Another attendee mentioned that he was interested in learning more about how CAMPO helps to influence regional transportation decisions regarding bike and pedestrian projects (especially the Triangle Bikeway project).
- Another attendee expressed his frustration with the history of transportation planning, specifically highway construction replacing communities of color. He also expressed his frustration with how the new sections of I-540 are tolled instead of the northern portion, where those with higher incomes live.

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**Event:** Rolesville FunFest

**Location:** Redford Place Park, 121 Redford Place Dr., Rolesville, NC

**Date:** 11/1/2025 from 10:30am-1:30pm

**CAMPO Attendees:** Jacob and Bonnie

**Summary of Event:**

This event was an annual fall festival celebrating the town's emergency personnel and local businesses. The event was held in and around Redford Place Park near Rolesville Elementary School. There were nearly 120 local vendors and hundreds of attendees, representing multiple age, racial, and cultural groups. The pop-up table was located in the baseball field parking lot, not far from the food vendors. Staff engaged with roughly 40 people (roughly 3-5 minutes each); most of whom were living in Rolesville.

**Common Comments/Themes of Discussion:**

- General support for bicycle and pedestrian improvements, especially focused on Rolesville
- Support for Main Street improvements and continued development in Rolesville's Downtown
- Desire for transit connection from Rolesville to Raleigh. Liked the bus connection to Wake Forest but felt it is too far away and direct route would be more beneficial, at least for commuters. Direct bus routes along US 401 between Rolesville High School and Wake Tech and Downtown Raleigh desired.
- Safety: Cars on two lane roads and in town around Rolesville are going too fast. Unsafe for pedestrians, especially children.

Within our downtown areas, streetcars (maybe even using old rollways to reduce cost of tracklaying) could provide good last-mile connections. Since Raleigh buried instead of ripped up its streetcar tracks, the potential of bringing about a system with similar performance to Kansas City's well-performing service is fully there. To summarize: Please grant more attention to rail services instead of just more buses.
